REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: Council President Reese declared a quorum present and opened the Regular City Council meeting at 7:00 p.m.

The following members of the City Council were present: Dale Sluder, Mike Wallace, Tammy Swaner and Payson Reese. Mayor Pierson was absent.

Council President Reese led the Council and audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES: Council President Reese asked for corrections or additions to the minutes of July 5, 2017. There were none. Motion made by Councilwoman Swaner to accept the minutes as presented. Councilman Sluder seconded the motion, all in favor, no opposition. Motion passed unanimously.

Department Initiatives:

Data Driven Approach to Crime and Traffic Safety (DDACTS): Based on the last reporting period’s crime data map, enhanced enforcement was directed into the southwest quadrant of the city. The identifiable “HOT SPOT” for this reporting period is still the southwest quadrant of the city. Officers are being directed to continue on focusing their patrol time in this quadrant.

School Safety and Security Detail: School not in session.

ITD/OHS Emphasis Patrol: SPD participated in the Idaho Transportation Department, Office of Highway Safety from June 9th, 2017 through June 30th 2017. We increased traffic stops from 66 to 102 during this period. One stop Officer Thongsana made resulted in the seizure of over 100 grams of Marijuana. This amount is considered a Felony in the State of Idaho. Officer Green was also able to make a stop resulting in a DUI, Open Container, and Possession of Marijuana. Several citations were issued for speeding, stop signs, and fail to provide proof of insurance.

Chief’s Upcoming Monthly Focus: For the upcoming month we will be focusing on 4th of July. We will also be focusing on the fair and rodeo and sending an officer to conduct foot patrols throughout the day to show officer presence and to engage with the public.

DECISION ON 2017-18 FUNDING FOR Southern Idaho Rural Development: This issue was discussed at the last budget workshop, however no decision was made as it was not an agenda item in the regular meeting at that time. Councilwoman Swaner made a motion to deny funding for Southern Idaho Rural Development for the 2017-18 budget year. The motion was seconded by Councilman Wallace. Council President Reese called for a vote and there were two in favor of the motion and one vote in opposition. The motion passed.

CORRESPONDENCE/MISCELLANEOUS: Clay Ritter advised the council that the Library has received a Seagraves Foundation grant in the amount of \$13,000.00 to finish repairs in the library.

Dena discussed doing the rating sheet for the engineering firms that responded to the RFP for the water assessment project. She will have rating sheets available before the next city council meeting.

EXECUTIVE SESSION IF NEEDED: Council President called for an executive session per I.C. 74-206 1 (b). Councilman Wallace so motioned. The motion was seconded by Councilman Sluder. Roll call vote was taken as follows: Wallace: aye; Sluder: aye; Swaner: aye. Into executive session at 7:16 p.m. Out of executive session at 7:25 p.m.

ADJOURN: Councilwoman Swaner moved to adjourn. Councilman Wallace seconded the motion. All in favor, no opposition. Motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 7:26 p.m.
